SECTIONED DOCUMENT



Keep the stereo volume down
or use earphones or headsets.

Floor vinyl or thick linoleum
will soak up sound.

Buy quiet appliances.

Use vibration mounts under
electrical appliances, including
washer, dryer, and dishwasher.

Put foam pads under blenders, mixers,
and other small appliances.

Wear ear protectors when you are
using equipment or tools that produce
sustained loud sounds.
